Fatwire	-	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The content management system for the existing QNP (QNP 1.0). Often (erroneously) used to mean QNP in general terms; QNP alone remains hosted on Fatwire.
QNP (QualityNet Portal)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> QNP 1.0 Legacy QNP Qualitynet.org QualityNet Public Site QualityNet Portal 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The public-facing informational website at qualitynet.org (unauthenticated). End-users visit the site to view program information, download specifications manuals and documentation, etc. HSAG and other CMS contractors create and submit content to the content managers who use Oracle Fatwire to manage the site.
QSP (QualityNet Secure Portal)	-	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The secure portal for QualityNet (authenticated). The user must log into QSP to submit quality data.

H-CMS (Headless Content Management System)	Headless CMS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The headless content management system is a content management system (CMS) built from the ground up as a content repository that makes content accessible via a RESTful API for display on any device. It contains a content-management-ui for adding programs/metadata etc. as part of H-CMS. H-CMS is not the QNP replacement – it is the true and actual Fatwire framework replacement. ADOs may integrate for H-CMS functionality as part of their work, but that is independent of H-CMS and QNet 2.0.

Content Managers will log into the QNP Admin UI to manage/update content in QNet 2.0.
QualityNet.org replacement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> QNP 2.0 QNet 2.0 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The replacement for QNP (QNP 1.0). Redesigned public-facing website including an updated UI, responsive design, etc. – the H-CMS, QualityNet.org replacement Admin UI, and QualityNet.org replacement public facing screens collectively comprise the QNet 2.0 and therefore the QNP replacement. The external naming convention for the replacement system will remain “QualityNet” The internal naming convention for the replacement system will be QNP 2.0.
